To that end, on September 23, 2019, following our Republican City Candidates Meet & Greet held at the Mission Inn, we emailed a questionnaire to each Candidate for the purpose of determining their governing philosophies and how well they aligned with our caucus core principles.

We are grateful to those Candidates who chose to participate as they provided what we believe to be their honest and forthright answers to our questions. We reviewed each Candidate answer and assigned a numeric score based on how well each answer aligns with our caucus position. We then determined an overall letter grade for each Candidate. The scoring method we used is included as well as a <u>link</u> to the actual completed questionnaires returned to us by the Candidates.

We also extend our gratitude to each of these candidates for their enthusiasm, civic dedication and willingness to step into the public arena and serve as leaders in our community.

It is our hope that this scorecard will advance our core principles while informing fellow Republican voters and our community at large of the governing philosophy of these Republican Candidates.
